AOP - Infrastructure

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Roads

- AOP dropped by 39%
- Guangzhou City Northern Ring Road (廣州市北 環高速公路) was closed 4 months for major maintenance works. It was re-opened in early November 2009
- Tangjin Expressway (Tianjin North Section) (唐津高速公路(天津北段)) up 28% in average daily traffic flow
- Pearl River Delta projects in general recorded an increase in traffic volume

Energy

- AOP surged 407% due to lowered coal prices and rise in power demand
- Combined electricity sales of Zhujiang Power Plants (珠江電廠) increased 11%
- Electricity sales of Chengdu Jintang Power Plant (成都金堂電廠) up 10%
- Macau Power (澳門電力) sales volume up 7%



- AOP increased by 30%
- Chongqing Water Plant (重慶水廠) reported 20% growth in daily average sales volume
- Shanghai SCIP Water Treatment Plants (上海化學工業區水處理廠)
 - ➤ Industrial water sales volume up 17%
 - ➤ Sewage treatment volume up 10%
- Macau Water Plant (澳門水廠)
 - ➤ average daily sales volume up 3%
 - Concession contract renewed for 10 years to 2020 with further extension allowed to 2030

Ports & Logistics

- AOP decreased by 12%
- ATL Average occupancy rate dropped from 99% to 97%
- Economic downturn has slowed down China's import and export
- Throughputs of Xiamen New World Xiangyu Terminals (廈門象嶼新創建碼頭) and Tianjin Orient Container Terminals (天津東方海陸集裝箱碼頭) recorded a drop by 2% to 3%

China Rail Container Terminals Project

Kunming Terminal

- Commenced operation in Jan 2008, handled 185,000 TEUs in 2009
- Target handling 280,000 TEUs in 2010
- Making modest profit
- Other ancillary facilities such as warehouses are also in operation





Chongqing Terminal

- Commenced operation in Dec 2009, handled 11,300 TEUs in Jan 2010
- Target handling 150,000 TEUs in 2010

Facilities Management

- AOP up by 27%
- > HKCEC
 - Recorded an AOP increase of 23%
 - Enhanced contribution upon the completion of Atrium Link expansion in April 2009
- > Free Duty
 - AOP surged by 60%
 - Achieved outstanding result due to increased passenger traffic flow at Lo Wu and Hung Hom stations and increased patronage at Lok Ma Chau station



Contracting & Transport

- Overall AOP increased by 30%
- Contracting
 - ➤ Gross contract-on-hand: HK\$26.6 billion*
 - ➤ Remaining value: HK\$14.8 billion*
- Transport
 - > AOP improved due to lower fuel costs
 - Patronage in both bus and ferry services dropped



Financial Services

- AOP increased by 222%
- Disposed of 52.86% shareholding in Taifook Securities and continue to hold 9% stake
- Tricor has successfully expanded into 21 cities in 12 countries/territories and its contribution remained stable
